Let's ask the internet

lifeindenmark.dk is the official information platform for internationals living in Denmark. Here, you will find information about health care, family and children, insurance, pension etc. You will also find your digital mailbox, Digital Post, in which you receive and reply to letters from public authorities. The Danish equivalent to lifeindenmark.dk is borger.dk

international.aarhus.dk is the City of Aarhus' website for all internationals living in Aarhus. Find information about registrations when coming to Aarhus (permit, CPR, MitID) culture, sports and leisure, language training, communities and socializing, waste and recycling, housing, job search, starting your own business, change of foreign driver's license, traffic and transport, childcare and school, change of address, studying, events and much more.

[Internationalcommunity.dk](https://internationalcommunity.dk) is the website of international community – an Aarhus-based organisation hosting a range of events for internationals throughout the year. Find at International Community's website the largest calendar of events in English in Aarhus and surrounding areas, including informative, socializing and cultural opportunities.

[Internationalstaff.au.dk](https://internationalstaff.au.dk) is Aarhus University's website for their international staff members. Find events, their expat partner programme etc.

[Skat.dk/english](https://skat.dk/english) is the English website of the Danish Tax Authority. If you have income in Denmark, you need a [tax card](#) (after residence permit/EU residence document and CPR number and MitID) which is a digital card showing how much tax you will have to pay on your income.

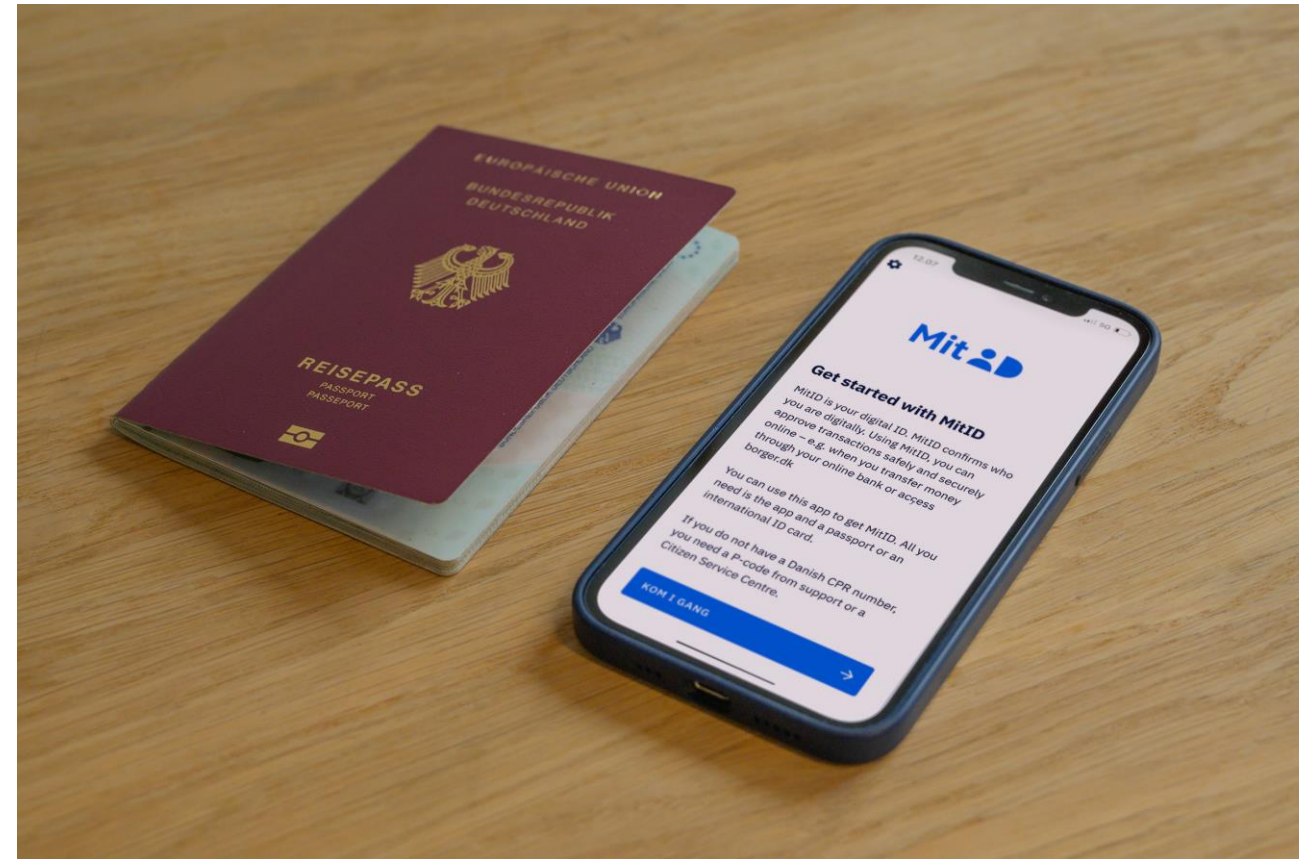
Activating your MitID:

Scan your passport / international ID card using the MitID app (wait 24 hours after getting your CPR!)

- If problems: book an appointment with Citizen Service (Borgerservice) - certain requirements e.g. bring your health insurance card and passport

MitID

You get MitID in relation to getting a CPR number with Citizen Service (Borgerservice) or an International Citizen Service.

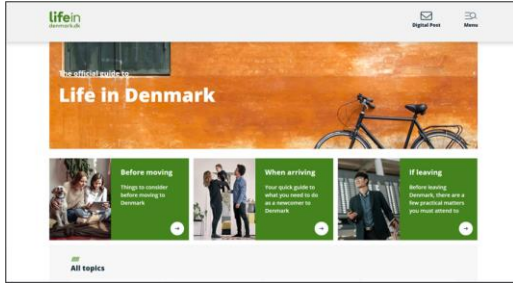
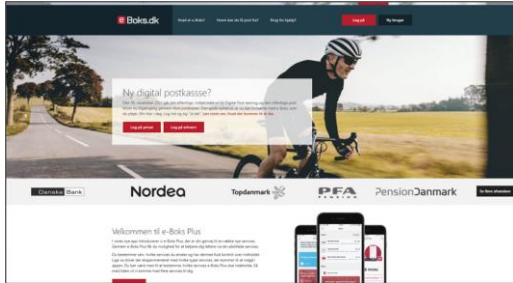

DIGITAL POST FACT:

In Denmark almost all post from public authorities – state, region, municipality - is sent via Digital Post.

You access your digital postbox using MitID

[Digital Post \(borger.dk\)](https://borger.dk)

- If you have a Danish CPR number you'll receive Digital Post from public authorities. You will NOT get this post in your physical postbox.
- Once you have a CPR number and a MitID, you will be able to access Digital Post through the Digital Post icon at the top right corner of lifeindenmark.dk or the Digital Post app, which can be downloaded in the App Store and Google Play Store.
- Do you wish to use e-boks or mit.dk, you must set-up a digital postbox on one of these platforms.



WHAT IF I GET ILL?



Before having a CPR number

- You are **not covered by Danish health insurance** before getting a CPR number
- You may have to **pay for hospital care**
- Some exceptions apply (e.g. **EU rules or Nordic residency**)
- Bring a valid **European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)** if you can
- The EHIC means your **home country covers your costs**
- If you are from **outside the EU/EEA**, get **private travel insurance**

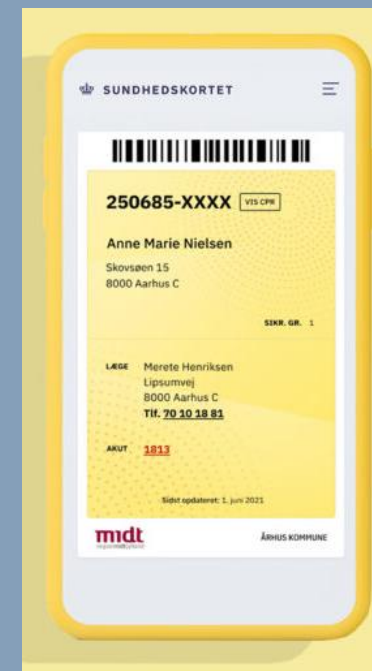

Your GP

- Treatment for mild diseases
- Prescriptions – pick up at the pharmacy asap after
- Contraception
- Gynaecological examinations
- Referrals to specialists / other healthcare professionals (there will typically be a co-payment for treatment) or hospital treatment
- Referral to midwife when pregnant
- Some vaccinations (e.g. flu) Children's vaccination programme (mostly private clinics for travel vaccines – Rejseklunik)
- Mental health – symptoms of stress, depression, anxiety, other conditions

- If your child is sick, you call your GP. Paediatricians in Denmark work in hospitals for more serious illnesses.

How and when to contact your GP?

Call - weekdays 8-16

- Talk to a GP within a certain time in the morning (usually from 8.00 - approx. 8.30/9.00)
- Remaining phone hours – usually until noon: talk to a medical secretary
- Dial the CPR number of the person you're calling about
- Acute appointment: When calling you're usually asked to dial a certain number or press a certain key – until 16.00 (4 pm)

Rule of thumb: call first!

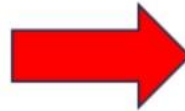
During normal work hours (8-16):

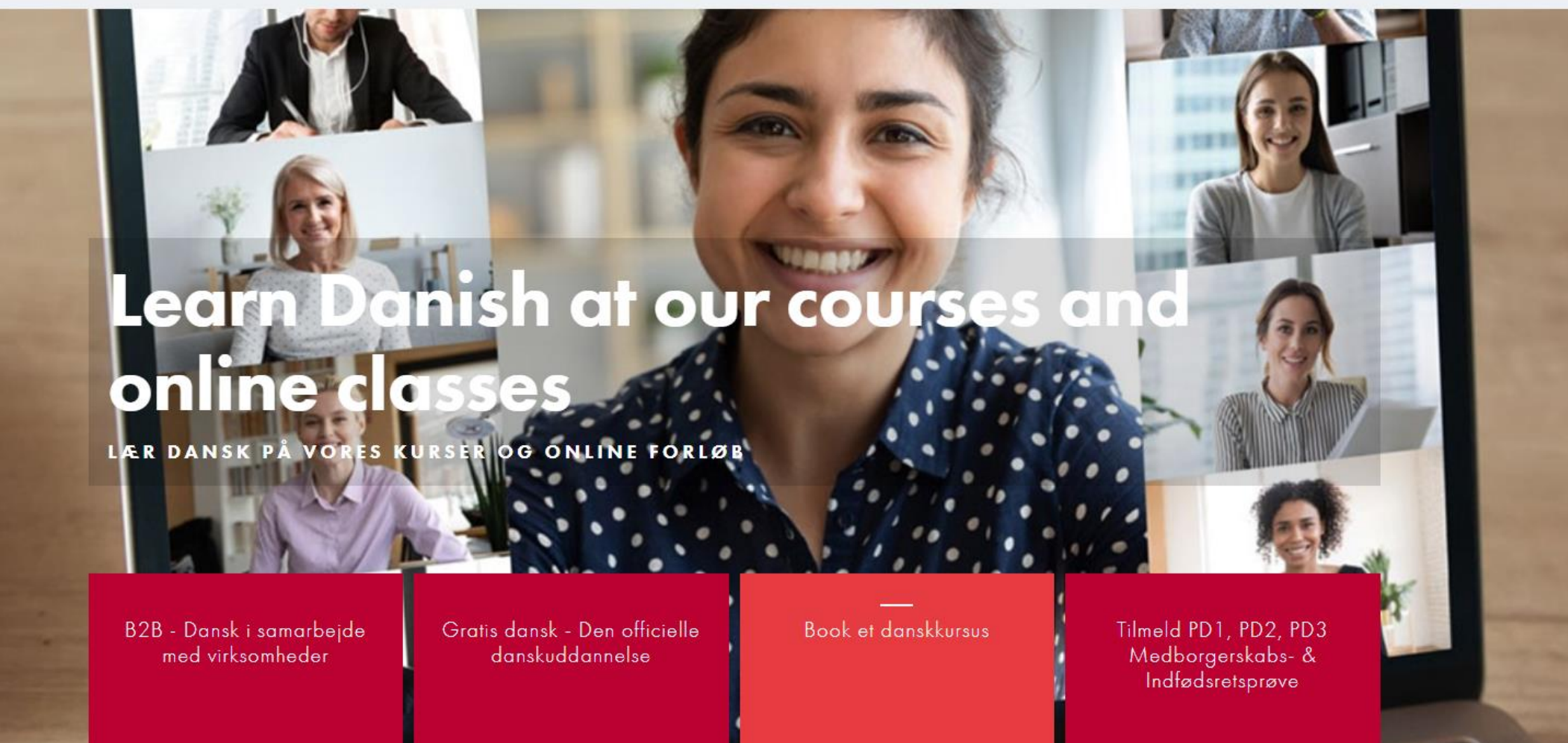

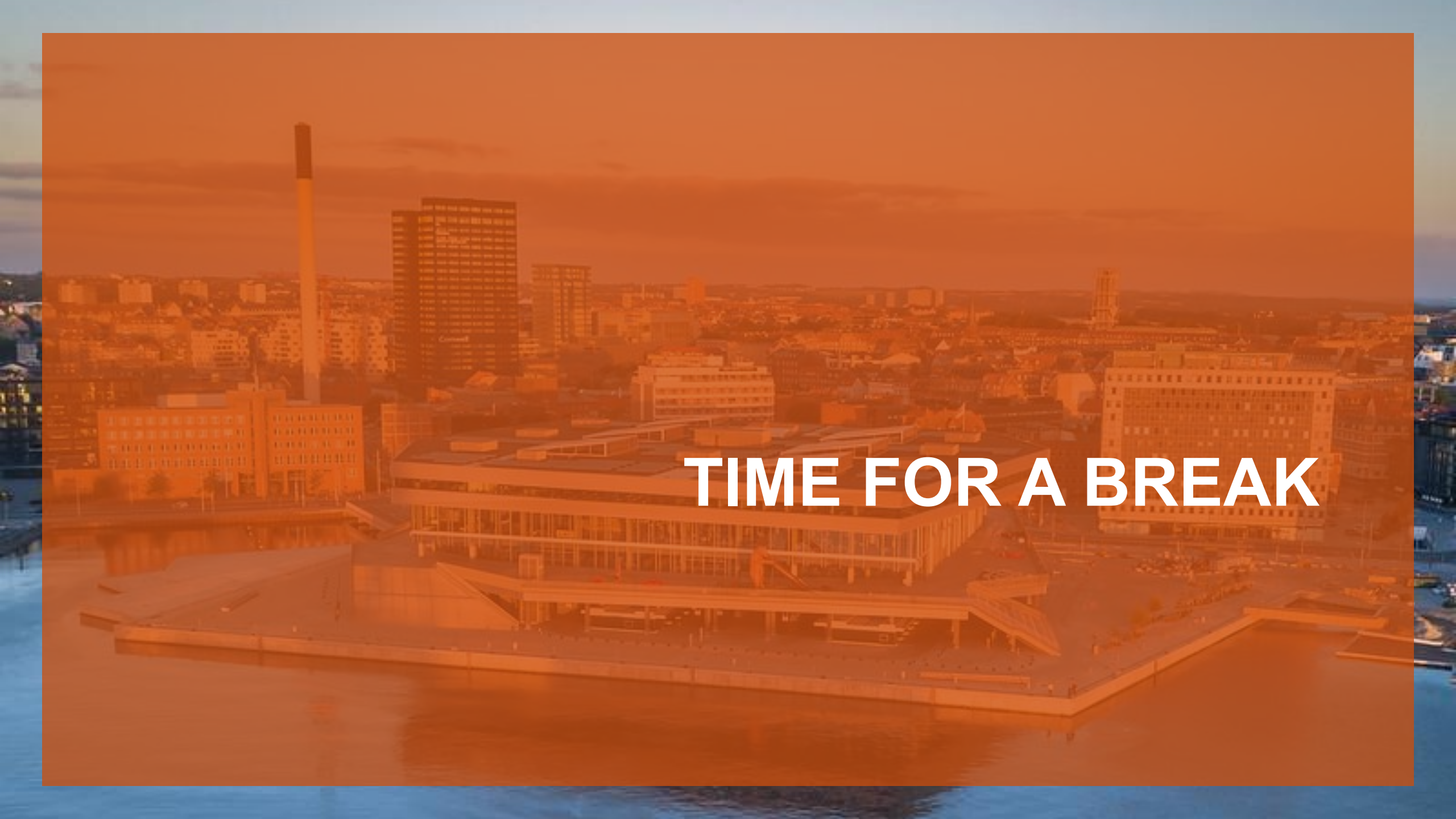
As a newly arrived international citizen residing in Aarhus, you are, in most cases, entitled to receiving a referral to the free official Danish Education.
